We put people first





We are all unique and we all learn in different ways. That is why we focus on the individual, in collaboration with parents, to create happy and well adjusted students.

Our teaching staff, including the principal, know each child by name and care for and accept them for who they are. We challenge ourselves to become familiar with each student's strengths and needs so we can tailor our learning methods to have the most positive impact. We place a strong emphasis on individual welfare, administer a consistent approach to behavioural management, and have a student wellbeing team that meets regularly.



We welcome and encourage parent involvement in our school. Whether in the classroom, on school excursions, special days or activity nights, involvement is highly valued. Research tells us that parent involvement improves students academic, social and emotional wellbeing. At St Brigid's, parents are partners and regularly connect face to face and via our SeeSaw platform.

Being close to the township, we provide many opportunities to broaden our students educational experiences through: tours of local businesses; local volunteer programs; nature and discovery walks; library visits and a swimming program. Contemporary learning environment and approach



St Brigid's has open and adaptable flexible learning spaces that encourage critical thinking and collaborative learning. Students are able to gravitate towards areas and seating arrangements where they feel most comfortable. Our contemporary learning spaces are resource and technology rich. This, along with multi-age classes which enhance student cognitive and social growth, are representative of current and future work environments and are considered to better nurture creativity and entrepreneurship in students.



We develop in our students the capacity for self-management and learning how to learn. Rather than the old approach of lecturing to students, we emphasise teaching children through the Inquiry approach, which is student-driven learning. This encourages students to remain curious and be adaptable and flexible.

We prepare and empower students to master essential academic content; to think critically and solve real-world problems; to work collaboratively and communicate effectively; to be self-directed in their education; and to have a growth mindset in the face of adversity and challenge.
